INTRODUCTION

COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY (CEDS)

The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) is a regionally-owned planning process designed to build capacity and guide economic growth and the resiliency of a region.

CEDS is a program of the United States Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA). The Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 (PWEDA) requires federally designated "Economic Development Districts", such as the Northwest Tennessee Development District (NWTDD), to develop and maintain a CEDS in order to (1) establish a regional economic development strategy, and (2) maintain the region's eligibility for EDA grant competition and programs. The program requires annual updates of the CEDS as well as a full re-write of the CEDS at least every five years.

The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) document is a significant component of remaining a designated Economic Development District (EDD). Continued eligibility of the Northwest Tennessee Development District is based upon completing an update of the CEDS, in conformance with 13 CFR Chapter III §303.6, every 5 years (at minimum) and submitting a supplemental annual report for all other years. In 2017, NWTDD submitted its 2017 CEDS 5-Year Update to the EDA, which can be found on NWTDD's website: www.nwtdd.org.

2020 CEDS ANNUAL UPDATE

The following Annual Update demonstrates the progress made by the region over the past year in the execution of strategies called for in the 2017 CEDS 5-Year Update. The update involved the work of committed individuals from both the private and public sector who desire to support the continued, positive growth of the Northwest Tennessee region. As required by the CEDS program, this strategic plan "is designed to bring together the public and private sectors in the creation of an economic roadmap to diversify and strengthen the regional economy."

EDA CARES ACT FUNDING

SUPPLEMENTAL EDA AWARD FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS - DISASTER ECONOMIC RECOVERY COORDINATORS -

As part of EDA's CARES Act Recovery Assistance, EDA invited the NWTDD to apply for a supplemental award to help respond to the unusual and compelling urgency of the COVID-19 pandemic and future disasters. A supplemental financial assistance award of \$400,000.00 was granted to the NWTDD to aid in response, mitigation, recovery, and resiliency programs over a 24 month period of performance. NWTDD has hired 2.5 Disaster Economic Recovery Coordinators to coordinate the efforts supported by the supplemental EDA Award.

PENDING EDA CARES ACT FUNDING - LAKE COUNTY INDUSTRIAL SITE IMPROVMENTS

Tiptonville was assisted in applying for a CARES ACT Grant, in the amount of \$625,000, for industrial site improvements to the Tiptonville Port and Lake County Industrial Park project.



ADJUSTMENTS TO THE 2017 CEDS

The economic conditions of the region have been largely unchanged since the 2017 CEDS 5-year Update, with the exception of the impacts of the global COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. The full effects of the ongoing pandemic have not been fully realized at this time. Data collection efforts in 2020 have been severely slowed and hindered by the pandemic. Future CEDS Annual Updates will include an expanded focus on the impacts of COVID-19 and disaster recovery/resiliency planning.

This section highlights necessary adjustments made to the 2017 CEDS 5-Year Update.

NORTHWEST TENNESSEE DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT BOARD & STAFF

Northwest Tennessee Development District (NWTDD) is an association of 47 municipalities and nine counties (Benton, Carroll, Crockett, Dyer, Gibson, Henry, Lake, Obion, and Weakley County) organized to advocate and promote economic and community development in the region.

Currently, the district office employs 30 full-time and 5 part-time persons and many other persons, full-time and part-time through the Area Agency on Aging administered contracts. A 59 member Board of Directors composed of nine county mayors and forty-seven city/town mayors in our district and 3 members-at-large governs the District. The Executive Committee is comprised of the nine County Mayors and three Members-At-Large.

COVID-19 AND ECONOMIC IMPACTS

In 2020, the Coronavirus (also known as COVID-19) was declared a global pandemic. President Donald Trump declared a public health emergency under the Public Health Service Act in January and declared a nationwide public health emergency in March.

In March, 2020, Governor Lee declared a state of emergency in Tennessee to facilitate the treatment and containment of COVID-19. In April, 2020, Governor Lee issued a safer at home order, which mandated non-essential community members to remain at home through the end of April. As of November, 2020, cases continue to rise. Governor Lee has extended an executive order allowing Tennessee local governments to require face coverings in public through the end of 2020. Four of the nine counties in the District have enacted mask mandates.

COVID-19 has resulted in the closure of businesses and schools, the cancellation of major events throughout the spring/summer/fall, and ongoing restrictions that have negatively impacted all of the communities in Northwest Tennessee.

Economic recovery from the global pandemic in Northwest Tennessee will take several years and require special attention from the NWTDD. At this time, it is unclear what the full impacts of COVID-19 will be on the local and regional economies. The NWTDD is committed to monitoring COVID-19's impact and building our communities back stronger than ever.



SUPPLEMENTAL EDA AWARD FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS

In May, 2020, the CARES Act Recovery Assistance initiative and the Economic Development Administration (EDA) invited the NWTDD to apply for a CARES Act Supplemental EDA Award to prevent, prepare for, and respond to current and future disasters. NWTDD was awarded \$400,000 to assist the region with the COVID-19 response and to develop a Disaster Recovery/Resiliency Economic Development Plan tied to the current CEDS plan.

NWTDD has hired 2.5 Disaster Recovery Coordinators to carry out the grant over a 24 month period. The Disaster Recovery Coordinators will work to identify impacted areas, encourage collaboration among community leaders, outline strategies, and locate sources of funding for mitigation, recovery, and resiliency projects in our development district.

Future CEDS Annual Updates will include an expanded focus on the impacts of COVID-19 and disaster recovery/resiliency planning.

PROGRESS ON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 2017 CEDS 5-YEAR UPDATE

NWTDD MISSION

- Increase variety of employment sector opportunities.
- Utilize long-term planning to improve conditions, strategies and problem solving capabilities in our region to stay economically competitive with other regions.
- Assist in the improvement of community infrastructure to provide for new economic growth, as well as to support existing businesses.
- Encourage the importance of land use planning in stimulating and directing economic development.
- Work with and assist economic development professionals in our region.
- Encourage local economic and community development initiatives by providing technical support, offering facilitative services, and coordinating resources for individual communities, groups, and projects.
- Facilitate and participate in regional networking activities in an effort to foster public/private relations.
- Maintain the most current and relevant demographic and economic data available, and inform communities that this information is available.
- Assist disaster and pandemic mitigation, recovery, and resiliency efforts. (added in 2020)



KEY ECONOMIC PERFORMANCE INDICATORS LABOR FORCE, EMPLOYMENT, UNEMPLOYMENT, & RETAIL SALES

Tracking Tennessee's Economy research is conducted by Dr. Murat Arik, director of the Business and Economic Research Center at MTSU in partnership with the Tennessee Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations (TACIR).

A majority of counties saw a 100% increase in the number of unemployment claims in April and May, at the start of the pandemic quarantine period. Unemployment numbers continue to recover but remain high compared to the pre-COVID-19 period. Sales tax collections dipped in April but remained largely unchanged through August, due in part to the issuance of stimulus checks in April.
