General Assembly in 1973 to be
the delivery system for human
resource services in the nine
counties of the region.

The Elderly Nutrition Program and the Senior AIDES Program were the initial programs operated by the NWTHRA. The NWTHRA has now expanded its services to offer public transportation and in-home services.

Currently, the NWTHRA employs people at the district office and throughout the nine counties to deliver these services, using a combination of federal, state and local funding. The staff and agency are overseen by a governing board composed of elected officials from all nine Northwest Tennessee counties.
